**About BreastScreen Victoria**

BreastScreen Victoria saves lives by finding breast cancer early – when it's too small to see or feel.

75% of breast cancers occur in women over 50. That's why we offer free and quick 10-minute breast screens for women and trans and gender-diverse people aged 50 to 74, with no breast symptoms every 2 years. Women aged 40 to 49 and over 74 can also book a screen, however we recommend having a conversation with a doctor first to make sure it's the right option. All breast screens are performed by women radiographers and no doctor's referral is needed.
